- 34 VOICETHREAD <http://voicethread.com/> Upload pictures, talk about them and share them with learners. They can ask questions and you can listen to them. Alternatively, learners send you spoken assignments and you can listen and comment on them. You can also upload their written work and record yourself marking and commenting on their work as you do it.
- 35 PREZI <https://prezi.com/> You and your learners can use this tool to make presentations that zoom in and out of the key information.
